



The Hg Foundation and IFS Foundation come together to boost STEM education in Sri Lanka

London, United Kingdom, 29 November 2024 – The Hg Foundation, a grant-giving charity focused on improving tech education and skills, is partnering with the IFS Foundation to promote STEM skills in remote and rural communities in Sri Lanka.

According to the <u>World Bank</u>, poverty in Sri Lanka has risen from 11.3% in 2019 to 25% in 2022. Poverty rates tend to be higher in <u>rural</u> areas of Sri Lanka due to limited access to <u>education</u>, sanitation, fresh water, and healthcare, as well as economic dependency on agriculture.

The IFS Foundation works in partnership with remote, rural communities throughout Sri Lanka to help break this cycle of poverty. The Foundation invests in public health, employment and school infrastructure, enabling sustainable, thriving communities and giving children access to a decent education. A particular focus is STEM skills, given less than 60% of the population is digitally literate, with less than a quarter of households owning a laptop or desktop computer.

In alignment with its mission to improve tech education and skills, The Hg Foundation's £64,000 grant will support the creation of a computer lab and staff training to deliver IT and STEM classes in the village of Weralugahamula, where the IFS Foundation is currently active. The project is due to complete in 2025.

More than 50% of Weralugahamula's population lives below the national poverty line. The creation of a computer lab forms part of a wider program of work to rebuild the entire school, increasing school participation up to age 18, and creating a safer learning environment. The lab will help students acquire computer literacy and build STEM skills, creating pathways to access high-quality tech jobs in future. The IFS Foundation delivered a similar project in the village of Welusumanapura in 2022, where refurbishment including a dedicated computer lab nearly doubled school participation.

Other investments in the community include reverse osmosis water treatment plants, sanitation facilities, economic diversification, and upgrading healthcare infrastructure. These projects help remove the obstacles that prevent children from getting access to a proper education.

Stephen Keys, Chair of the IFS Foundation, said:

"We believe education is the key to improving health, reducing poverty, and eliminating gender inequality. Education, especially STEM skills, leads to better, and more stable jobs that pay higher income. This accumulation of wealth can be used to improve health and wellbeing outcomes for individuals, families and entire communities. We are deeply grateful to the Hg Foundation for funding this project."

"I've seen first-hand the brilliant work of IFS and the IFS Foundation in providing tech teaching, jobs and fantastic career development for hundreds of people per year from less advantaged situations in Sri Lanka.
